The Centrality of the Cross is a New Garment, a New Identity!

In Zechariah 3:4, God clothes Joshua with a pure garment and removes his filthy garments. God says, "Behold, I have taken your iniquity away from you, and I will

clothe you with pure vestments." giving him new clothes, God gave him a new identity. (Also see Isaiah 61:10 through 62:5 for a parallel story.) Believers, this is foreshadowing God's provision of Christ as the new garment to wear, the new identity to receive. We were once filthy and our identity was found in our sin and shame (Ephesians 4:20-24). Now, as a believer, you are no longer clothed in unrighteousness, guilt, shame, and condemnation. You have been given a new garment of the righteousness of God (Isaiah 61:10).

At the fall (Genesis 3) Adam and Eve tried to clothe themselves with fig leaves after forfeiting their perfect identity. God clothed them instead with the skin of an animal (Genesis 3:7, 21), showing us the very first foreshadowing of the Cross of our Christ. The covering of skin with the sacrifice of the animal by God was temporary. It was not to be the eternal way that God would clothe us. God had a plan. He was going to reclothe us, not just covering our body parts, but renewing our whole soul with a new garment of righteousness, redeeming our identity to His.

Through the Cross of our Savior Jesus Christ, we have been given this new garment of justification which is the righteousness of God (Romans 3:21-31). The beauty in justification is the same beauty of the Cross. Sin has been dealt with. That gives us the new garment of righteousness. The Just, who is God, is also the Justifier. He passed over our sins and clothed us with Himself. By passing over our sins. He did not just ignore our sins. There had to be a payment for sins and that was death (Romans 6:23). We know that Christ died, paying for our sins. The main point here, like Adam and Eve, is we are no longer to clothe ourselves. That is the beautiful thing. We cannot clothe ourselves with the garment of God. He has to clothe us. In the same way, we cannot remove my old garment of unrighteousness. God has to remove it for me. Both taking off the old garment of unrighteousness and putting on the new garment of righteousness is supernatural. We cannot do either. God has to do it. How can I give Jesus my sin? How can I give Jesus my garment without God taking it off? It is a miracle of God. Both the putting off of the old and the putting on of the new are equally miraculous works of God through the Cross of Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Most of the men who come to the mission are clothed with a fig leaf garment of shame, condemnation, and guilt that they have made for themselves, before they have accepted Christ as their Savior. We have to understand that they have become attached to their fig leaf garment, so that when we point out that they are wearing their own garment, we are speaking into how they identify themselves. The hope is, the Word of God and the Holy Spirit revealing the distortion of their old garment, they will begin to see how God is giving them a new identity. Through faith, they are no longer naked and ashamed (Revelation 3:18). This new identity works from the inside out. exchanged our old identity with His image and likeness. Once this truth is realized in the men, then they become that beautiful New Creation that Paul spoke about in 2 Corinthians 5:17 "therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a New Creation. The old has passed away; behold the new has come".
